M.O.V.E. Training



We recently had numerous staff attend a training called M.O.V.E. M.O.V.E stands for Movement Opportunities Via Education. It is an activity-based program that increases the level of independence needed for sitting, standing, walking and transitioning.

This is implemented here at WoodsEdge by increasing student independence and not using wheelchairs. There are more in-classroom physical therapy services instead of pulling kids out of class to do physical therapy. We have new equipment in the building such as changing stations, pacers, activity chairs. This helps students move more during natural times of day.


