Interventions in place to support student growth:

- Research-based reading and math curriculum
- Increased reading comprehension activities in all core areas of instruction
- Small group/individualized reading instruction
- More frequent progress monitoring
- Additional time spent in instruction in reading and math
- Title 1 Tutors
- Reading Specialist support
- Consideration for an extended school year for students who did not recoup skills

\*Most students in our programs are special education students with significant disabilities. There are a few students at the Juvenile Home Schools who are not identified as having special needs. Due to the low number of students assessed in each grade these data and demographics are not reported because results could be identifiable to an individual student.
