FINANCIAL REPORT

The federal grant period for Kalamazoo RESA Head Start is November 1 through October 31, however, the program year runs September through June. Kalamazoo RESA operates with a blended funding model (multiple funding sources) for its Pre-Kindergarten program, utilizing funds from the state grant for 4-year olds, Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP), to provide services to additional children in Kalamazoo County, and allow for many classrooms to operate for a full day rather than a half day.

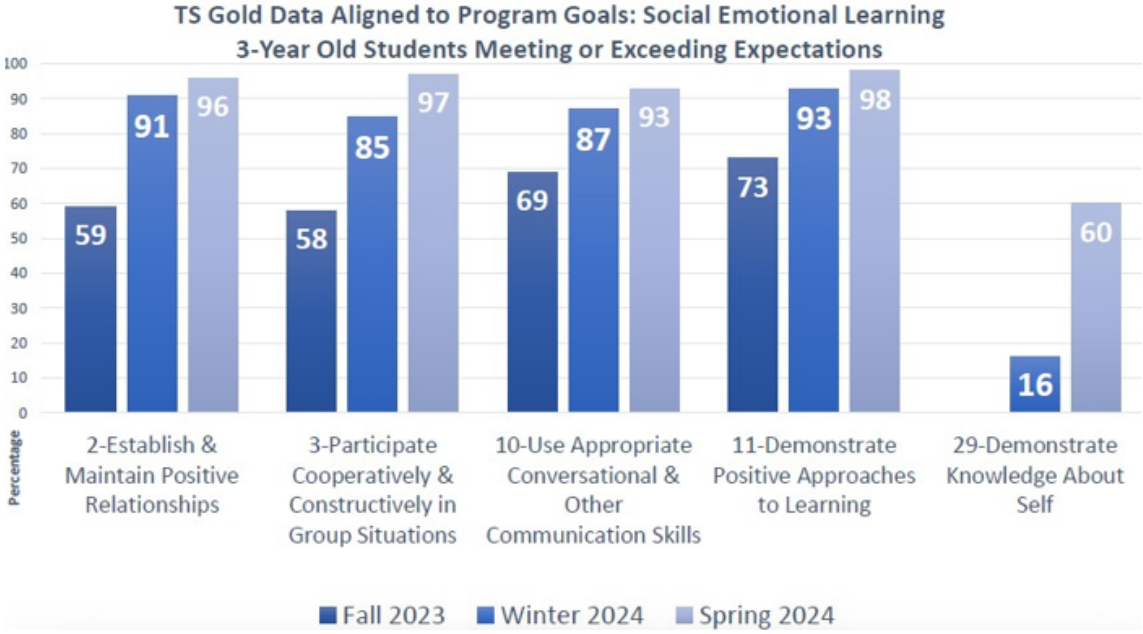
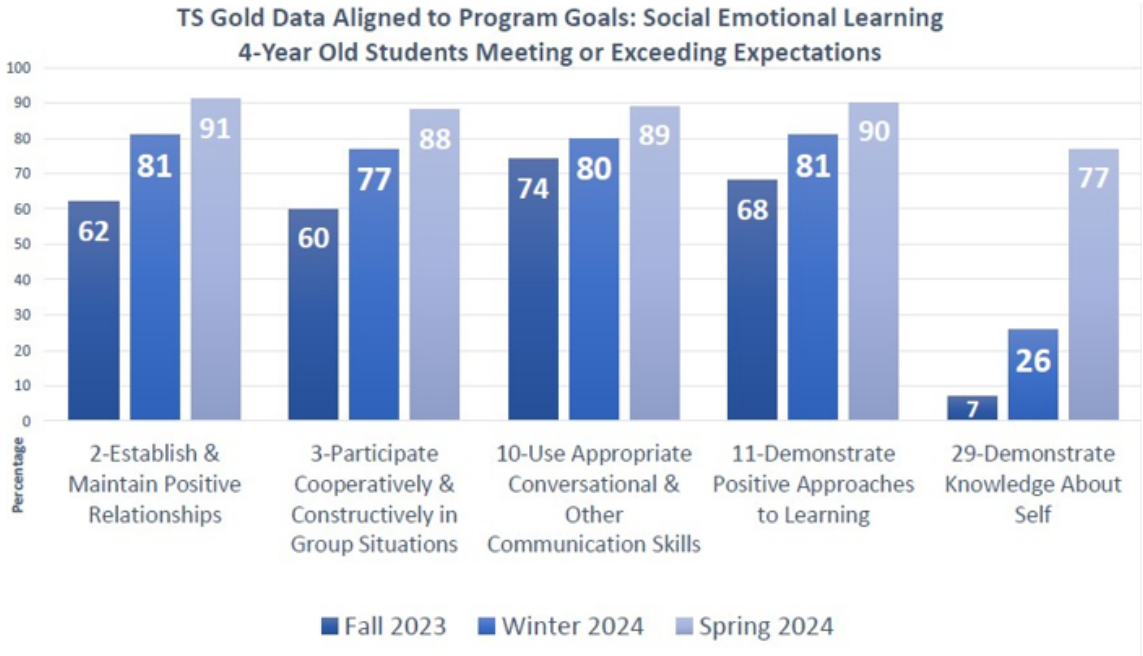
School Readiness

Kalamazoo RESA Head Start believes in early intervention and investing in the future of our children. Teaching Strategies Creative Curriculum for Preschool is the focal curriculum. This curriculum is a comprehensive, research-based curriculum designed to assist teachers with implementing developmentally appropriate and content-rich lessons for children with diverse backgrounds and skill levels.



KRESA Head Start / Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP)

The Kalamazoo RESA Head Start/GSRP preschool program is part of the collaborative and inclusive effort of Kalamazoo County Pre-K, which is composed of Head Start, the Great Start Readiness Program and Kalamazoo County Ready 4's. Its mission is to provide equitable, high-quality and developmentally appropriate services to support the whole child and whole family. In partnership with families and the community, these programs build a strong foundation for children's developmental skills and empower families to engage in their child's educational journey, starting at birth.



The Social-Emotional Learning Team

The SEL Team provides additional supports and further direct contact with students in the classrooms. Along with opportunities to meet with students in small groups or individually, the team also hosts ongoing monthly support meetings for families. The family support groups focus on social-emotional learning for both the adults and their children and serves as a platform for families to share ideas, situations, and concerns they hold in common.

- 71%** of families engaged in family service team (FST) meetings
- 11** families attended SEL Support Workshops
- 79** Students referred to PET and 66 qualified for IEP



Family Services & Engagement

Kalamazoo RESA Head Start provides programming and support to engage and empower the whole family.

Services include:

- **Family Advocates**
Provide further support through a personal relationship with families
- **Policy Council**
Parents and community members collaborate on program decisions, hiring and recruitment.
- **SuperMEN**
A networking and support program for male models
- **Health Services Advisory Committee**
Families, staff and community members promote and provide comprehensive health-related services and support
- **Abriendo Puertas/Opening Doors**
Parenting and leadership advocacy program for Latino parents
- **Parent Committees**
Monthly meetings at Head Start sites where families can network and discuss topics of interest
- **Parent Workshops**
Evidence-based workshops designed to support parenting skills and family relationships
