Current Structure

Classroom:

- Large, split classroom with dividers and individual technology for each student
- Special education support provided 1:1 or small group in adjacent classroom
- Two additional classrooms utilized on an as-needed basis for small group instruction or for transition specialist pull-out

Curriculum:

- Courses are aligned to Michigan State Standards and CCSS
- Most courses are computer-assisted model with small group and individualized instruction to support platform curriculum


Staffing:

- 1.0 Program Director/Certified Teacher
- 1.0 Certified Teacher
- 1.0 Special Education Certified Teacher
- 2.5 FTE of classroom support/ non-certified transition specialist

Schedule: Two sessions offered (AM: 7:00–11:30, PM: 11:45–4:15)

Middle School Integration: Proposed Options


Blended Session

- Main classroom designated for HS students
- 2 East Classrooms designated for MS
- Special Education remains in designated room
- 1 certified teacher/1 education assistant in MS classroom
- 1 certified teacher/1.5 education assistant in HS classroom
- Special education push-in

Separate Sessions

- High School session runs in am/ Middle School session runs in pm
- Staff splits students into two classrooms in each session/aid or transition specialist support and certified teacher in each room.
- SPED will push-in or pull-out, to meet needs of students with IEPs and 504s
- **As noted at the March 1 meeting, it would be possible to welcome HS to both sessions and keep MS in one session only (during small start-up phase). These models are not an "all or none."**

- Schoolwide PBIS support
- Social Skill development



- Only one student in hallways, bathrooms, etc.
- Staff communication via walkietalkies
- Precise check-in and dismissal procedures
- Students are responsible to get to/from bus stop
- Meals picked up from KPS

Current Center Procedures

These current procedures are a sample representation of some of the structure already in place to ensure safety and comprehensive programming for all students.

- Bussing/ Transportation for MS students
- Meal access—currently staff leaves the school to pick up meals
- Parent Communications—creating parent understanding and buy-in for YAA school opportunity
