

Participants receive soft skills training, technical training, community-based internships, job placement assistance and supportive services

YOUTH MOBILITY PASS

This year MyCITY Kalamazoo, in partnership with Kalamazoo Metro and the City of Kalamazoo Foundation for Excellence, piloted the Youth Mobility Pass (a pass which will be issued to all Kalamazoo Public High School students beginning fall 2019). Every participant in the 2019 MyCITY Kalamazoo Summer Youth Employment Program received a Youth Mobility Pass which allowed them to ride on any Metro bus June 17-August 23.

During this pilot:

- 10,553 rides were recorded using the Youth Mobility Pass.
- Of those who used the pass, 51% said they used it daily.
- Over 47% said "work through MyCITY" was one of the top two reasons they rode the bus.



GEAR UP WITH WMU

A new partnership with **Western Michigan University** piloted a series of career exploration day camps for Career 101 participants this year. This partnership with WMU's Office of Pre-College Programming's GEAR UP allowed youth to spend three weeks exploring a variety of careers on campus within several colleges including:


- » College of Health and Human Services

GEAR UP facilitated both hands-on activities and workshop-style sessions covering topics from financial literacy to leadership skills.


