The KRESA Early On team offers free evaluations and support for family members and caregivers. The team consists of early childhood teacher consultants, speech-language pathologists, occupational therapists, school social workers, physical therapists, and parent educators.

PREPRIMARY EVALUATION TEAM (PET)

Ages 3-5

The Preprimary Evaluation Team (PET) provides free evaluation services for children suspected of having developmental differences. PET conducts evaluations and collaborates with the local school district to develop a service plan if the child is eligible for special education. A team of professionals assists the family in investigating all appropriate programs available for their child, including special education. These programs may be offered by the family's local school district, through KRESA or other community agencies.
