Articulated Credit Requirements

- 1. Student must apply for credit at KVCC within two years of high school graduation. Baker College requires application within 12 months.
- 2. Student must earn a final grade of B or higher in both semesters or at least two trimesters. Baker College requires a B- or better for the same terms.
- 3. Student must have teacher recommendation.
