

## CTE LAW ENFORCEMENT



Through a partnership between Kalamazoo Valley Community College, Kalamazoo RESA, and local law enforcement agencies, the Career and Technical Education (CTE) Law Enforcement program offers a unique, non-traditional opportunity to high school juniors and seniors. CTE's Law Enforcement program is taught by a retired Public Safety Officer (PSO) and includes several guest speakers from throughout the criminal justice profession.

The course puts tremendous emphasis on responsibility, maturity, and leadership. Utilizing events from the local and national levels, students will discuss how the criminal justice system shapes and influences society. Classroom discussion will include an examination of state, local & federal law and the applicable courts. An emphasis on knowledge of the law, application of the law, interpersonal communication skills and physical fitness will be stressed. Students can earn articulated KVCC college credits through successfully fulfilling class requirements.

## 2023-2024 CTE Law Enforcement Program Guidelines

To be successful in the CTE Law Enforcement program, students need to agree to these program expectations.

#### **CTE Law Enforcement Year 1**

- 1. The Law I program is held Monday through Friday through the school year. The classroom is located on KVCC's Texas Township Campus. IT IS NOT A KVCC program.
- 2. Transportation to and from the program is a district decision. Questions about transportation availability need to be directed toward the student's home district.
- 3. Students will be required to work together as a team and will periodically act as team leader.
- 4. Late assignments will not be accepted, unless due to an excused absence or as required within IEP or 504 accommodations.
- 5. Students are to call in or sign out with the class instructor when going to be absent from class for any reason.
- 6. Students are assigned a class time according to their home school's slot availability.
- 7. Students will be expected to dress appropriately during all class related activities, including physical training (PT).
- 8. High school and college credit **may** be earned for this course. College credit is dependent upon the student receiving a B or better.
- 9. Workplace observations take place outside of class time. Transportation is the responsibility of the student.

#### **CTE Law Enforcement Year 2**

Students will fulfill all the expectations of Law Enforcement Year 1 as well as the additional requirements listed below:

- 1. Students must consent to a criminal background check to participate in their internship.
- 2. Students will be held responsible for their actions in and out of the class regarding disciplinary and criminal behavior. Criminal activity, of any kind, may result in the student's removal from their internship. Issues are examined on a case by case basis.
- 3. Students will successfully pass a drug screen to participate in their internship.
- 4. Students should have no more than 4 unexcused absences during a semester and maintain an 80% grade point average and 90% employability skill score to be eligible for workplace observation or a second-year internship experience.
- $\frac{1}{2}$  Information about the uniform and personal grooming will be explained in depth during the orientation and the first week of class.

#### Personal grooming will consist of:

- Uniform clean, pressed, and in good repair
- Clean hair; if shoulder length or longer, must be tied back
- Clean hands & fingernails; no longer than the tips of your fingers.
- Only one pair of post earrings. No other jewelry except one ring and watch.
- Avoidance of heavy perfumes and colognes
- Tattoos may not contain profanity, sexually explicit and/or discriminatory content, words, or images. Tattoos containing such content must be concealed by clothing or band-aids where appropriate.

#### Class uniform will consist of:

- Slacks in the color and style specified
- Shoes in the color and style specified
- Polo shirt in the color and style specified
- Belt and socks in color and style specified
- Sweatshirt in color and style specified

	Ethics and integrity are paramount. Honesty, being trustworthy, taking initiative, and demonstrating leadership are essential. All students are expected to demonstrate honesty and integrity at all times, including self-reporting of a violation of school policy or the law. Failure to demonstrate the proper ethics could result in dismissal from this course.
	I will clean up after myself.
	I will read each assigned chapter, take notes and ask good questions.
	My safety is always paramount. Safety topics will include active shooting, highway, road, scenario-based events, consideration to ice, fire and electrical lines.
	I will keep electronic device use to the absolute minimum.
	I understand that confidentiality will not be breeched. Discussing the people involved at an event, videos, or the internships sponsors involvement with an event, outside of my parents/guardian and CTE Instructor will not be permitted.
	HIPAA (Health Insurance Portable and Accountability Act) policies will be discussed in class and I understand the implications of violating any portion of the policy can result in termination of placement and potential civil litigation.
	I will read and abide by the CTE/EFA Off-Site & Transfer Programs Student/Parent Handbook.
	I will always put forth 100% effort while participating in this program especially in the physical fitness portion. Any physical restrictions or injuries will be reported to the instructor as soon as possible.
	I will not class post photographs on any social media sites without approval from the course instructor.
	It will be the decision of the student and parent/guardian for participation at the gun range, fire tower, ride along opportunities and other police/related events. Though every precaution will be made to create a safe environment, the scope of the profession and involvement in the program can encompass inherently dangerous situations.
