EDU 107 Introduction to Teaching

The eligible student earned a minimum grade of B (3.0 out of a 4.0 scale) and completed all 12 segments of the program. The credit is applied to the CMU B.S. in Education degree (BSEd).

Steps to obtain the credit:

Apply to CMU and be admitted within five years of completing the CTE Teacher Academy program. Indicate an interest in teacher education.

- Share your completion of a CTE Education Program with the teacher education academic advisors at CMU's Freshman Orientation.
- Receive Introduction to Teaching (EDU 107) credit upon successful completion of 12 credits at CMU.

Western Michigan University

The student who has

- successfully completed CTE's Teacher Academy course with a B or better and at least a 90% attendance record and passed an end of course assessment,
- has applied to and been accepted at WMU,
- has declared a major in the College of Education and Human Development

is eligible for <u>up to six (6) credits</u> to be applied to their WMU transcript. Each case will be handled individually by WMU to determine the credits that each student will have earned.

- Fill out the section called Student Information. You will need your Western Identification Number.
- In the section called CTE Contact, fill in this information:

Ferris State University

To receive articulated credit at Ferris, a student must:

- Apply for credit within two years of high school graduation.
- Complete the Articulated Credit Application/Verification form, gather necessary documentation, obtain appropriate signatures, and request that the career technical center/high school send the form and documentation to Ferris State's Office of Transfer and Secondary School Partnerships. Application
- Complete secondary career technical education course competencies with a "B" or better final grade.
- Provide a classroom management plan.
