

# R.T.S.I. PUPIL TRANSPORTATION VIDEO/DVD LIBRARY

- ❖ **A Matter of Time-(Tape 1)\*\*\***  
Length 10 minutes- Defensive driving and accident prevention with examples of hazards that enter the roadway.
- ❖ **Be Cool Follow the Rules (Tape 53) \*\*\*\***  
Length 15 minutes- Entertaining and humorous for students in grades K-4. Student daydreams he is a secret service agent responsible for safely getting a queen and her jester to school on the bus. Teaching safety rules at the bus stop, on the bus, emergency evacuation, and unloading at the school.
- ❖ **Brakes and Braking (Tape 46)**  
Explanation of how braking systems work. Hazards while stopping a school bus. Good demonstrations and graphics.
- ❖ **Buster and the Booster (Tape 54)\*\***  
Length 19 minutes- Buster and the Booster visit an elementary assembly. Arriving at the bus stop, good bus behavior, and emergency evacuation are discussed.
- ❖ **City Driving/Country Driving and Everything in Between (Tape 6)\*\*\***  
Length 19 minutes- Common sense approach of possible road hazards in all types of driving environments.
- ❖ **Common Sense- Insuring Your Personal Safety (Tape 7)\*\*\*\***  
Length 12 minutes- Examples of how a driver can prevent injury to themselves while around or in the bus.
- ❖ **Confidential Records: Training for School Bus Drivers (DVD Peggy Burns)\*\*\*\***  
Length 16 minutes- Peggy Burns presentation with hand out materials.
- ❖ **Drive Smart- Arrive Safe (DVD)\*\*\***  
Length 18 minutes- Railroad Crossing Safety Training for School Bus Drivers- from Operation Lifesaver.
- ❖ **Driver First Aid (Tape 12)\*\*\***  
Length 18 minutes- Over view of First Aid procedures that a driver should be prepared to perform.
- ❖ **Driver Perception Course (Tape 13)\*\***  
Length 28 minutes- Search, Identify, Predict, Desire, and Execute road hazard collision prevention. Viewer is asked to search and identify road hazards, and then chose the accident evasive maneuver.
- ❖ **Driver Perception Test (Tape 14)\*\***  
Length-varies- Observation Test- 40 Fast moving driving scenarios, each with 4 multiple choice answers. After all questions have been asked the "best" answer is revealed with an opportunity to stop the video for group discussion. Video time is 60 minutes + group discussion time.
- ❖ **Driving the Activities Bus (Tape 15)\*\*\***  
Length 14 minutes- Assignment, planning and successful execution of a field trip. Offers suggestions of how to prepare for unexpected complications while on a field trip.
- ❖ **Evacuating the Special Needs Bus (Tape 17)\*\*\***  
Length 16 minutes- Reenactment to demonstrate a variety of methods to evacuate a special needs bus.
- ❖ **For You, The Veteran Driver (Tape 19)\*\***  
Length 26 minutes- Instructional lecture format with video demonstration of why it is important not to be complacent with your driving skills. The video reminds drivers how to maintain a safe driving record.
- ❖ **Legal Issues in School Transportation (Tape 21)**  
Length 103 minutes- Video of a presentation explaining the legal complexities of Federal and State Law, Local government and District policy while transporting students. Examples include special needs transportation issues.
- ❖ **Let's Ride the Bus (Tape 56)\*\***  
Length 8 minutes- Kids interview Buster about bus stop procedures.
- ❖ **Loading and Unloading (Tape 22)\*\*\***  
Length 21 minutes- Introduction to loading and unloading passengers. Disclaimer that State laws may not allow all examples of student stops.
- ❖ **Loading and Unloading the Special Needs Bus Tape (23)\*\*\*\***  
Length 14 minutes- Overview of pre-trip, student stop, loading, observing, unloading and post trip of a special needs bus.
- ❖ **Managing the Middle School Student (Tape 24)\*\*\***  
Length 45 minutes- Lecture format on the understanding of the developmental stages of the middle school student to better prepare the driver why this age group exhibits certain behaviors.
- ❖ **Michigan Alcohol Impaired Driving Laws (Tape 47)\*\*\***  
Length 10 minutes- Realistic Reenactments of an impaired driver and an accident in Ingham County.
- ❖ **Preventing Disaster at the Crossing (Tape 27)\*\*\*\***  
Length 18- A presentation why a school bus must use care at rail road crossings. Video footage and dramatic recreations of school bus and train accidents. Includes interviews with a train engineer and passengers.
- ❖ **Putting the Brakes on Harrassment (DVD Peggy Burns)\*\*\*\***  
Interactive Peggy Burns presentation with workbook.

- ❖ **Regarding Amy (Tape 44)\*\*\*\***  
Length 16 minutes- Twilight Zone theme. Comparison of how seat belt restraints respond in automobiles verses in a school bus, Includes crash test footage.
- ❖ **Safe Driving Principals (Tape 28)\*\***  
Length 18 minutes- Driving hazards from the bus drivers perspective. Footage includes incidents of moving, stationary, weather, mental and mechanical failure hazards. Footage was gathered in two days of filming (some footage is not stable). The video encourages defensive drive practices.
- ❖ **Safety in the Balance- The Cost of Not Buckling Up (Tape 48)\*\***  
Length 10 minutes- The video shares safety and financial statistics supporting seat belt use in personal vehicles.
- ❖ **School Bus Safety Bus Stops and Danger Zones (Tape 51)\*\*\*\***  
Length 12 minutes- Instructional video for student audience regarding bus stop rules and safety zones around the bus. Good graphics and direct message for the student.
- ❖ **Steering Clear of Liability (DVD 71)\*\*\*\***  
This DVD presents situations when a bus driver's decisions may not have been in the best interest of the student. A Discussion Guide accompanies the presentation to promote district policy discussion.
- ❖ **The 5 See's of Driving- How to Avoid Becoming a Statistic (Tape 29)\*\*\***  
Length 14 minutes- Safe driving rules for accident prevention. SEE high, SEE all, SEE an out, SEE that you are seen.
- ❖ **The Critical Factor (Tape 30)\*\***  
Length 10 minutes- How to control of a commercial vehicle when experiencing a rapid air loss from a tire while driving.
- ❖ **The Professional Driving Course- Reference Point Driving (Tape 31)\*\*\*\***  
Length 32 minutes- Good tips and practical exercises to establish reference points of the vehicle in relationship to obstacles. Including: Backing, Serpentine, Lane Position, Tail Swing, Parallel Parking, and Overhead Clearance.
- ❖ **The Safest Way Out (General Education-Driver Version) (Tape 32)\*\*\*\***  
Length 16 minutes- Demonstration of when and how to evacuate the General Education student from the school bus. There is a small section referencing special needs students.
- ❖ **The Safest Way Out (Special Needs) (Tape 33)\*\*\*\***  
Length 17 minutes- Demonstration on when and how to evacuate the Special Needs student from a school bus.
- ❖ **The Safest Way Out ( Student Version) (Tape 60)\*\*\*\***  
Length 12 minutes- Instructional evacuation video with K-8 students. This video demonstrates front, rear, side, roof, and combination emergency evacuations.
- ❖ **Transporting a Emotionally Handicapped Student (Tape 38)\*\*\***  
Length 12 minutes- Interview format of considerations when transporting the emotionally handicapped student.
- ❖ **Transporting a Mentally and Physically Handicapped Student (Tape 39)\*\*\***  
Length 13 minutes- Interview format of considerations when transporting the developmentally delayed student.
- ❖ **Transporting Special Needs- Don't Lose Your Touch (Tape 35)\*\*\***  
Length 15 minutes- Video reminds personal that Special Needs students respond to appropriate and natural touching. Lack of such touch can confuse and distress the student. District needs to provide guidelines on what is appropriate.
- ❖ **Transporting Special Needs- Kids Are People Too (Tape 36)\*\*\***  
Length 20 minutes + group discussion- Perspective from the special needs student, are you meeting their needs?
- ❖ **Transporting Special Needs with Commitment and Care (Tape 37)\*\*\***  
Length 13 minutes + discussion time – Recognize the challenges of transporting the special needs student. Keep perspective and have focus to avoid over reaction. Stressing safety, keeping order, and the rights of others.
- ❖ **Trouble Spots (Tape 52)\*\*\*\***  
Length 28 minutes- Behavior challenges a drivers may have with elementary, middle and high school students.
- ❖ **Universal Precautions for the Special Needs Bus (Tape 40)\*\*\*\***  
Length 10 minutes- Awareness of Blood borne pathogens, infectious diseases, and other bodily fluids with a demonstration of clean up methods.
- ❖ **Wheelchair Management (Tape 41)\*\*\***  
Length 10 minutes- Demonstrates the common guidelines for loading and unloading wheelchairs on a school bus.
- ❖ **Who's Liable (Tape 43)\*\*\*\***  
Length 22 minutes – This video outlines how liability is determined. Lecture with graphics explaining Duty, Breach of Duty, Cause, Damage or Injury
- ❖ **You Can't Live Without It- Safest Way Out (Tape 61)\*\*\***  
Length 16 minutes –Professional drivers interviews regarding seat belt use in a private vehicle.
