Project SEARCH

Project SEARCH is an unpaid internship located at Bronson Methodist Hospital. Students work various job rotations throughout the hospital. They must apply, interview, and successfully complete each mandatory activity to be able to participate in the program.

The work experience gained while attending YAP better prepares many students to transition to Project SEARCH successfully.







Exiting YAP

The timeframe for when students are ready to leave our program varies. Some students are ready after a year or two. Other students may attend longer to meet all their transition goals.

Our staff works together with you and your family to determine when you are ready to exit and begin your independent life. We are here to help you every step of the way and your success is what it is all about.
