

Kalamazoo County Food Distribution Sites

School districts across Kalamazoo County are setting up emergency food distribution systems to provide meals for children during the state-mandated closure. Food distribution is being conducted in a “grab and go” format. Families/students will pick up food to eat at home.

Meals are free to all children 18 years of age and younger and to persons up to age 26 who are enrolled in an educational program for the mentally or physically disabled that is recognized by a state or local public education agency. No application or proof of income is required. See below for specific information for all nine Kalamazoo RESA service area school districts.

Galesburg-Augusta Community Schools

The Galesburg-Augusta school district will distribute food to all students in the district beginning on Tuesday, March 17. Families will have two ways to pick up both breakfast and lunch to-go bags.

Starting at 10:00 a.m., school buses will complete their normal morning routes to deliver food to families. We are unable to tell families the exact times buses will be at each stop, but they will follow their normal routes from 10:00 – 11:30 a.m. Either the student or parent/guardian can be waiting at the bus stop. Volunteers will be handing out meals for lunch and the next morning’s breakfast.
